These gentlemen will be perpetually recognized on the www.policessoftball.com website and bring our Hall of Fame total up to 73.

Also at the World Series event we recognize our yearly achievement award winners and they include:

Zada Enterprises West Sponsor of the Year: OSS International (Concord Combo); OSS International has been a big supporter of the Concord Police Softball team and they are one of the big reasons for their success this year. Red is an original inductee into the PoliceSoftball.com Hall of Fame and he currently possesses over 75 tournament wins under his belt. This



year his team is currently tied for #1 going into the World Series and they have won two tournaments.

Shevy Wright Sportsman of the Year: Anthony Costanzo - Sacramento

who values the brotherhood of police softball above all else.

West Defensive Player of the Year: Nate Baez - SoCal Alliance;


Doesn't get much better than that.

East Defensive Player of the Year: Jeff "Biscuit"
